



Humans & Wildlife in the Sabah Landscape: From Conflict to Coexistence via community-based strategies

In the Sabah and Southern CFS Landscapes, the small remaining habitat area for elephants results in **Human–Elephant Conflict (HEC)**.

Humans compete with elephants over limited resources.

The animals forage and migrate through smallholder and company estates, **damaging crops**.

The lack of coordinated actions has exacerbated elephant protection problems, smallholders' economic vulnerability, and businesses' operational challenges.

We want to build an **in-person and virtual peer-to-peer platform** where smallholders and businesses can **share knowledge on strategies for coexistence with wildlife**.



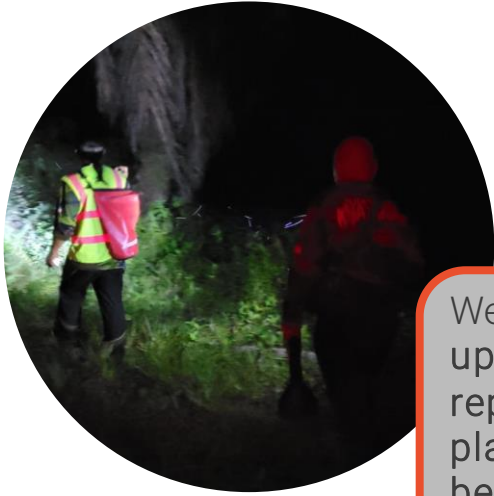
Earthworm has a permanent **field presence** and facilitates **HEC community monitoring** in Sabah since 2016.
